<b>AC Wendy</b>	Early season	Large	AC Wendy was developed by the Kentville Research Station in Nova Scotia. The strawberry is wedge-shaped to conic, with firm, bright red colored flesh. Wendy has excellent fresh flavor. Plants are vigorous and runner well. They are moderately resistant to powdery mildew and red stele, but susceptible to verticillium wilt. Frost damage potential, very early flowering. Trials showed Wendy to be highly productive, of good quality, and it held its fruit size throughout the season. We highly recommend this variety. Many of our customers report Wendy as being a consistent performer.	
<b>Galletta</b>	Early season	Large	Galletta was released by Dr. Jim Ballington, NC State University in 2010. Galletta ripens early season and produces large sized berries. Attractive, glossy fruit have excellent flavor. Customers are reporting that Galletta is highly productive and holds fruit size well through the season. It is rapidly growing in popularity. The plant is vigorous and shows tolerance to foliage diseases. Being an Earliglow hybrid, it has tolerance to Red Stele disease. We highly recommend this variety to all customers.	
<b>earli glow</b>	Early season	Med-small	"Wonderful strawberry flavor" is Earliglows's trademark. This variety produces fruit that has a firm, glossy skin, firm flesh, and medium size. Its sweet flavor makes the variety excellent for fresh eating and freezing. Fruit size tends to decrease as the season progresses. Earliglow plants are very vigorous and runner well. This variety has good resistance to red stele and intermediate resistance to Verticillium wilt. Recommended for beginners.	
<b>Cavendish</b>	Early midseason	Large	Cavendish strawberry, which originates in Nova Scotia, is the result of a cross between two varieties known for their winter hardiness and attractive, large fruit. It produces high yields that ripen over a long growing season. Excellent flavor and overall quality of the fruit makes this variety a good choice for commercial and home use. Cavendish is highly resistant to red stele and has some resistance to Verticillium wilt.

<b>Jewel</b>	Mid season	Large	<p>One of our top sellers, Jewel performs well over a wide range of growing conditions. Jewel strawberry is our #1 midseason variety, recommended for commercial growers and home gardeners. Jewel has large berries with superb quality and flavor. We have been very successful using Jewel for home gardening due to its overall quality and consistent performance. Plants have moderate winter hardiness. Care must be taken at renovation to maintain a good plant stand.</p>	
<b>Sonata</b>	Mid season	Large	<p>Sonata strawberry is from the Dutch breeding program, Fresh Forward and Burt Meulenbrook the breeder. This variety comes from a cross of Elsanta and Polka, two high performing Dutch varieties. Sonata expresses good plant vigor and shows tolerance to Angular leaf spot (<i>Xanthomonas fragariae</i>) as well as good winter hardiness. Sonata is productive and produces large, uniform, conic-shaped berries that are glossy bright red. We highly recommend planting Sonata based on its high performance. For best results, good rates of magnesium and nitrogen are required.</p>	
<b>AC Valley Sunset</b>	Late season	Large	<p>AC Valley Sunset was bred by Andrew Jamieson in Kentville, Nova Scotia. This strawberry is a late season variety that will ripen 5-7 days later than Cabot. Plant shows good vigor with no apparent foliage disease concerns. Berries are lighter red, shiny and large-sized. Flavor and yield are very good. With its softer skin, fruit is best suited for local fresh market to extend the season.</p>
